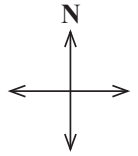

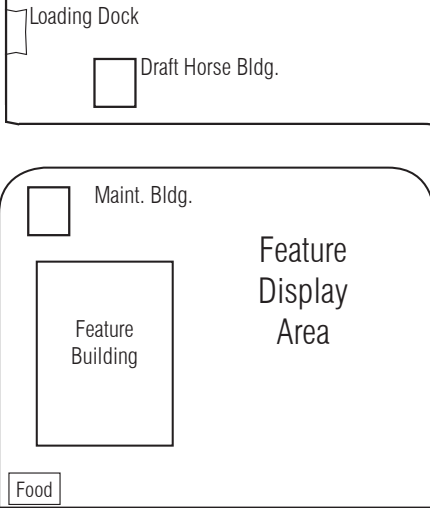

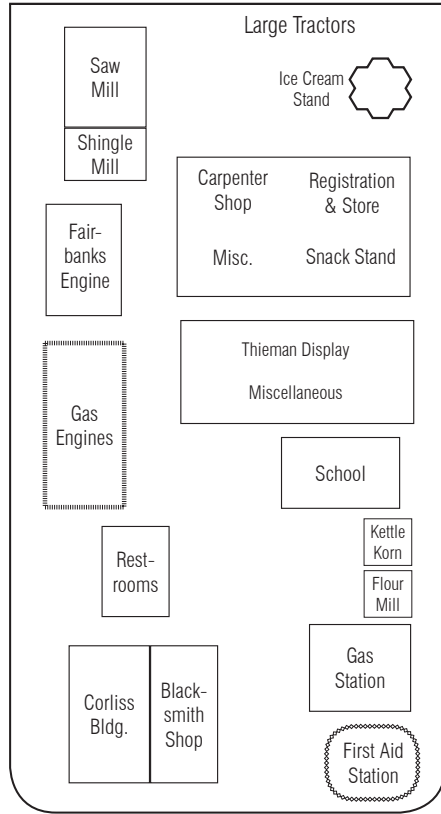

Show Site Features

- 75 acre show site owned by the Albert City Threshermen & Collectors Association
- Public restroom facilities and port-a-pots on the grounds
- 100 primitive camping sites on the grounds
- Loading dock
- Exhibitor truck and trailer parking on the grounds, approx. 8 acres
- Guest parking on the grounds, approx. 12 acres
- Trolley rides from the parking and touring the grounds
- Public address system throughout the grounds
- Field demonstration and activity area, over 24 acres
- Enclosed Exclusive Feature Building is 50' x 70' with display tables, outdoor area & optional tent
- Exclusive Feature vending/swap meet area, approx. 3 acres
- General tractor and equipment display area, approx. 7 acres
- Cafeteria and food vendors on the grounds
- Police, EMT and safety personnel on the grounds during the show; security over night
- Banquet facility/caterer near the show site

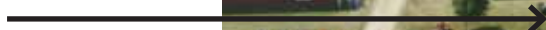

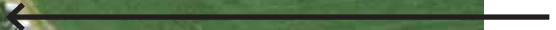

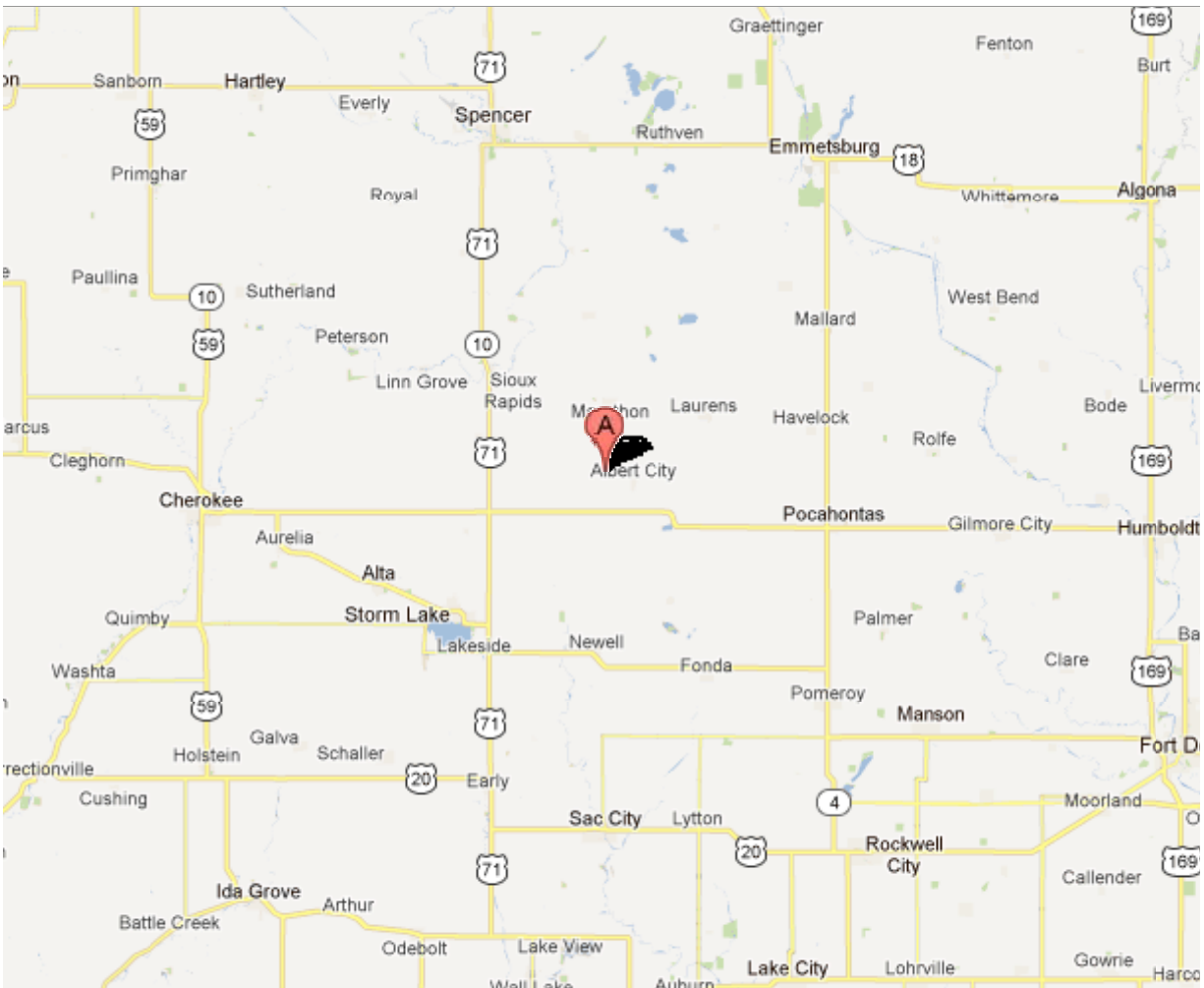

Railroad Museum

The L, M, & O Railroad Museum is located nearby in Marathon. The museum has been a project of the Lind, Maiden, and Okerberg families and opened in 1996. It features a depot from Pocahontas that is fully outfitted including the tools, ticketing and passenger areas. There is 1,000 feet of track with working lights and switches and visitors can actually take a ride around the track. The museum includes an all-wood executive car from the 1880s and much memorabilia from Marathon including an original ice house and shoe shop. Newell's Allee Mansion

A fully restored Victorian mansion listed on the National Register of Historical Sites. After a trip back in time at the mansion, you can step into another culture at Keith's Arab Heritage Museum - one of the largest, private collections of Middle East artifacts assembled in the area.

Buena Vista County Wind Farm

Northwest Iowa is rich, fertile farm ground, and beginning in 2000, planning and construction for another "crop" began. Sprouting from the fields came two of the nation's largest wind farms, producing clean and affordable, renewable energy for nearly 115,000 homes.

The Grotto of the Redemption, West Bend

Nine grottos tell the story of Redemption through Christ. Every imaginable colorful mineral and crystal has been incorporated into this miraculous mound. There are few rocks found in west-central Iowa, so Father Dobberstein traveled to the mineral havens of Hot Springs and the South Dakota's Black Hills in search of materials for his vision.

Historic Arnolds Park and the Iowa Great Lakes Region

Located about 50 miles north of the show site, features amusement park, boating, fishing and other lake attractions.
